

Camden County College has appointed Paul W. Smalls as director of the Educational Opportunity Fund (EOF) Program.

"In this role, he (Smalls) will direct recruitment, retention and college success for students in the EOF program," according to James N. Canonica, CCC's Executive Dean for Enrollment and Student Services.

Smalls will also assist with the overall enrollment and retention activities of students on the Camden campus, Dean Canonica says.

"My vision for the Educational Opportunity Fund Program is to provide quality resources, workshops, and platforms that support our





## Public Safety Department Recommends Safety Tips for New and Returning Students

The Public Safety Department wishes to extend a warm welcome to new and returning students! Summer is over and it's time to return focus to learning and advancement.

Our mission is to assist students in achieving their academic goals by ensuring a safe and comfortable learning environment. To help students with the transition back to college and in the interest of safety, the Public Safety Department offers this important information.

### Students Required to Carry ID Cards

Students are required to obtain and carry a valid student identification card. There is no charge for student I.D. cards. ID cards are issued by Public Safety at the Blackwood, Camden and Cherry Hill campuses. Any student who will be parking a vehicle on campus must obtain and display a CCC parking decal on their vehicle. Parking decals are also free and available from Public Safety!

### Parking Spaces and Driving Signs

Student parking spaces are outlined in **WHITE** paint only. Faculty and staff parking spaces are outlined in **YELLOW** paint. Ample handicap parking is available on all campuses. There is a posted 10 mile per hour speed limit on all campus roads and parking lots. Public Safety asks that drivers be mindful of the heavy pedestrian traffic on campus and travel at the posted speed limit.

Drivers should also take care to observe all posted "yield" and "stop" signs on campus roadways and at pedestrian cross walks. Though there are plenty of white-lined students parking spaces on all campuses, parking often can fill to near



capacity during times of high class volume (usually in the morning and early afternoon hours). To ensure yourselves ample time to find parking and get to your classes on time, we recommend aiming to arrive to campus fifteen minutes before the scheduled class time. At the Blackwood Campus each parking lot is numbered. Once parked, identify the parking lot number posted on the lot's lamp posts. Attempting to drive and re-park when changing classes is not recommended, as another convenient parking space cannot be guaranteed. Public Safety officers can assist vehicle owners with battery jump starts and with opening locked vehicles. Both of these services are performed free of charge. These services do require the signing of a waiver form by the vehicle owner.

### Emergency Phone System Available

In an emergency, Public Safety can be contacted using the campus-wide emergency phone system. These emergency telephone stations are located in all buildings and at

## Honors Program Offers Opportunity For High-Achieving College Students

The Camden County College Honors Program is a college-wide program that is open to students pursuing an Associate Degree in any major. The program includes Honors sections of general education courses that are already required of all AA, AS, AFA and AAS degrees.

The Honors courses are small, seminar-style classes which allow for extensive student/faculty collaboration, and they have interesting themes and projects that are different from the usual introductory classes.

In order to complete the Honors Program before graduation from CCC, students are required to take four of their general education courses in designated Honors sections, maintain an overall grade point average of 3.5 and participate in a total of three community service or cultural events. As an Honors student, you will be part of a supportive but rigorous academic community, and there will be special social and academic events just for your group. We have taken recent trips to New York City and Washington D.C., and we have a lounge/study area just for the Honors Program.

There are also several scholarships that have been created exclusively for Honors Program

Students, and we have admission agreements with Honors Programs at local universities. All of this will help you to make the most of your experience at CCC and to be better prepared for the process of transfer to a four-year college or university, be it in New Jersey or elsewhere around the world.

Students who have been successful in a college preparatory high school curriculum and who have scored well enough on the SAT or Accuplacer exams can be accepted into the Honors program directly out of high school. Students already enrolled at CCC in any associate degree program will be invited to apply as long as they have completed between 12 and 24 college credits and have earned an overall grade point average of 3.5 or higher.



most building entrances. In addition to the emergency phone system, students can find “blue light” call boxes along walkways on all campuses and near the athletic fields.

### Public Safety Locations

For Public Safety assistance, students can find us at both the Taft Hall Welcome Center and The Public Safety Office in room 100 of the Otto Mauke Community Center on the Blackwood Campus, the Taft Hall Welcome Center on the Blackwood Campus, in Room 116 of College Hall on the Camden City Campus and in Room 115 of the Rohrer Center.

Students attending class at the RETC building at Lakeland can contact the Blackwood Public Safety Office for assistance via the emergency phone system or by dialing **(856) 227-7200, ext. 7777**, or **(856) 374-5089**. Students are encouraged to save Public Safety’s phone numbers to their cell phone contact lists for quick access.

### Observers Urged to Alert Public Safety

Alert Public Safety if you observe a hazardous condition on campus like smoke, fire, spills, leaks, broken furniture or equipment, uneven pavement or suspicious smells such as gas or oil. When a hazard is encountered, call Public Safety and provide the location and nature of the hazard. If safe to do so, remain on the line with the dispatcher until an officer responds to your location to assist.

students for academic excellence and success,” Smalls says. “Our culture will reflect care and devotion for every student to maximize their opportunity to complete graduation.”

### Graduate of Rutgers University-Camden

Smalls received his bachelor's degree in history from Rutgers University-Camden. He has extensive experience working with support programs in the higher educational field. Most recently he was admissions coordinator since 2015 at Laurel Springs School, in West Chester, Penna. In addition, he has volunteered his time to many organizations as well as being active in a leadership role and as a mentor to young men with the San Diego Church of Christ, in California.

Smalls’ other educational experiences include serving as mathematics and high school teacher in Cherry Hill, N.J. He also worked as a customer service representative for Tuition Options, in Marlton, contacting students pursuing their degree; admissions advisor for DeVry University, and as an enrollment counselor for the University of Phoenix, at the institutions’ sites in Philadelphia.

### EOF Eligibility Requirements

What are the EOF requirements? Any student applying for admission into the EOF Program must meet the following requirements: Meet the established financial criteria and show evidence of historical poverty. Must not be in default on a student loan. Be a resident of New Jersey for at least a year. Be a full-time student at Camden County College. Must exhibit evidence of motivation and potential to succeed in college, although academically under prepared. Must demonstrate the ability to benefit from the services provided by the EOF Program at CCC.

First time and full-time students will be given first priority, receive a grant up to \$1,050 per academic year, and placed in appropriate courses based on skill levels.


